He had eight rainbows, best 2 lb, for a total weight of 8 lb 7 oz. Mr Porter, who comes from Ring-wood, Hampshire, fished a Black Pennell, Dunkeld, and White Muddler Minnow. He took his fish drifting from 'G' buoy to the Sludge Bank.
